
Remembering 9-11

(BOISE, Id)—Remembering 9-11, I was at the World Trade Towers October 16, 1993. Please pray comfort and healing as well as compensation for all those that lost family and friends in this tragedy.

Meet Me in the Stairwell

You say you will never forget where you were when you heard the news On September 11, 2001. Neither will I.

I was on the 110th floor in a smoke filled room with a man who called his wife to say ‘Good-Bye.’ I held his fingers steady as he dialed. I gave him the peace to say, ‘Honey, I am not going to make it, but it is OK..I am ready to go.’

I was with his wife when he called as she fed breakfast to their children. I held her up as she tried to understand his words and as she realized he wasn’t coming home that night.

I was in the stairwell of the 23rd floor when a woman cried out to Me for help. ‘I have been knocking on the door of your heart for 50 years!’ I said. ‘Of course I will show you the way home - only believe in Me now.’

I was at the base of the building with the Priest ministering to the injured and devastated souls. I took him

PM Bennett’s Statement at the White House, August 27, 2021

Communicated by the Prime Minister’s Media Adviser

Prime Minister Naftali and US President Joe Biden met at the White House yesterday (Friday, 27 August 2021) for their first diplomatic meeting. Following is Prime Minister Bennett’s statement to the media:

“First of all, on behalf of the Israeli people, I want to extend our condolences and deep sadness for the loss of American lives in

Kabul. American service members lost their lives while on a mission to save other people’s lives. That is the very definition of courage and sacrifice. May they rest in peace. Especially on this day I want to be crystal clear: Israel always stands together with the United States of America, unequivocally.

I also want to thank you for your words now and in our private meeting, which attest to your support of the State of Israel. But that’s not new, it’s been decades and you’ve always stood up for us, especially during tough times, like a few months ago, when thousands of rockets were being shot on Israeli towns and cities, and that’s when friendship is really tested. We trust in your support, Mr. President. And Israel knows that we have no better or more reliable ally in the world than the United States of America.

I come here from Jerusalem, our eternal capital, and I bring with me a new spirit, a spirit of goodwill, a spirit of hope, a spirit of decency and honesty, a spirit of unity and bipartisanship of folks who harbor very different political opinions, even opposing ones, yet we all share the deep passion to work together to build a better future for Israel. And that’s what Israel is about. We’re out to be good, to do good.

But in our region, doing good is not enough. Israel has to be strong in order to do good. Be strong so we can do good.

We cannot lose sight for even one moment that we’re in the toughest neighborhood in the world. We’ve got ISIS on our southern border. Hezbollah on our northern



border, Islamic Jihad, Hamas, Iranian militias that surround us. All of them want to kill us, kill Israelis. They all want to annihilate the Jewish state.

And that’s why Israel always has to be overwhelmingly stronger than any of our enemies, and indeed, of all our enemies combined.

That’s why I want to thank you,

Mr. President, for helping yet again to fortify Israel’s strategic advantage.

Obviously, the main issue we’re going to be talking about today here is Iran’s race to a nuclear weapon. We talked about it inside the room, and I was happy to hear your clear words that Iran will never be able to acquire nuclear weapons and that you emphasized that you will try the diplomatic route, but there are other options if that doesn’t work.

These very days illustrate what the world would look like if a radical Islamic regime acquired a nuclear weapon. That marriage would be a nuclear nightmare for the entire world.

Iran is the world’s number one exporter of terror, instability and human rights violations. As we sit here right now, the Iranians are spinning their centrifuges in Natanz and Fordow. We have got to stop them, and we both agree about that. So we have developed a comprehensive strategy that we’re going to be talking about with two goals. The first goal is to stop Iran’s regional aggression and start rolling it back into the box. And the second is to permanently keep Iran away from ever being able to break out to a nuclear weapon.

As I told you, Mr. President, Israel never has and never will ask America to send troops to defend it. That’s our job. We will never outsource our security. It’s our responsibility to take care of our fate. But, we do thank you for the tools and the backing you’ve been and are giving us.

You said we’re also going to be talking about Covid



The See You at the Pole Story

A small group of teenagers in Burleson, Texas, came together for a DiscipleNow weekend in early 1990. They came seeking God and little did they know how powerfully He was about to move. On Saturday night their hearts were penetrated like never before, when they became broken before God

and burdened for their friends. Compelled to pray, they drove to three different schools that night. Not knowing exactly what to do, they went to the school flagpoles and prayed for their friends, schools, and leaders. Those students had no idea how God would



use their obedience.

God used what He did among those teenagers and others who were holding similar prayer meetings at their schools to birth a vision in the hearts of youth leaders across Texas. The vision was that students throughout Texas would follow these examples and meet at their school flagpoles to pray simultaneously. The challenge was named See You at the Pole™ at a brainstorming session during a meeting of key youth leaders. The vision was shared with 20,000 students in June 1990 at Reunion Arena in Dallas, Texas.

Only God had envisioned how many students would step up to the challenge. At 7:00 a.m. on September 12, 1990, more than 45,000 teenagers met at school flagpoles in four different



From Denver Rescue Mission, Denver, Colorado

Alberts story



The power that addiction can have over a person is immense, but some choose the narrow road to recovery. In July 2020, Albert, a former Denver Rescue Mission volunteer, found himself in desperate need of the New Life Program. It is because of your faithful giving that Albert has been clean from drugs for a year and is filled with hope for the road ahead.

The Start of the Road

Despite a turbulent upbringing in East Los Angeles with a family immersed in gangs and drugs, two things have been constant joys on Albert's road: baseball and fishing.

"I can talk baseball all day and fishing all night," he said. "I grew up in a drug house. Growing up in the lifestyle that I did, we didn't do much, but we went fishing and we went to baseball games."

At 22, he moved to Colorado in hopes for a clean slate. For many years, he maintained the stable life he hoped for. He worked as a construction estimator, loved going to Rockies games, frequently served meals at the Mission, and was passionate about serving the homeless community with his church.

About five years ago, he got into a romantic relationship that led to a major setback. "She was an addict, and when things started going bad, I thought the way to fix the problem would be to do drugs with her," he said.

"I never thought I'd be there...being homeless is not me." – Albert

His addiction to meth started taking away every aspect of stability that he worked so hard to achieve, until he was left with nothing.

In January 2020, he spent time sleeping on the streets—memories that are clouded from constant drug use. "I never thought I'd be there...being homeless is not me," he said.

With nowhere to go and no resources, he remembered his volunteer days. "I thought, well, I know one place I can go, and that was Denver Rescue Mission."

A Fork in the Road

In April 2020, Albert made a life-changing decision. He had been staying at the National Western Complex (NWC), the Mission's temporary shelter that opened in response to COVID-19, and he was away partying for more than a week. When he returned to NWC, a sign on the door presented his options.

NWC had closed, and he had a choice to go to another shelter or apply for the New Life Program, a year-long rehabilitation program for men.

"Seeing that sign really woke me up," he said. "I realized it's either going to be now or never. I'd rather spend this [year here] now than lose five or 10 more years of my life, or maybe even lose my life."

Randal's story



A Former Plumber Gets A Second Chance

As a longtime drinker who ended up destitute, I can't believe how much God has changed my life since I sought help at the Rescue Mission.

I am far from the person I was when alcohol addiction left me homeless. I have a well-paying job at Standard Plumbing, helping professionals and do-it-yourselfers find the parts they need for plumbing projects.

Since I am an experienced plumber who has worked here in Salt Lake, a lot of the plumbers say hi to me when they come into our store, but it is the do-it-yourselfers who I love to help most.

They come in and explain a project they are working on. I often tell them that they really "MacGyvered It," a reference to the TV show MacGyver, whose title character seems able to get out of any rough situation with duct tape and spare parts. It's rewarding to help the do-it-yourselfers figure out how to get out of the plumbing jams they created. I explain what went wrong with their approach and find them the right parts they need to fix the problem themselves. That's satisfying.

It's great to feel needed again, and make a good living doing it. It was just three years ago, that I hit bottom for the first time and started living on the streets. I had made a good living for most of my life as a plumber. But I drank way too much. My consistent drinking led to my divorce in 2001. To this day, my wife has not remarried and I still feel like we love each other, but she doesn't trust me to stay sober, based on our history.

We have three children together (all adults now with lives of their own) and I know they were hurt by my alcoholism as well. But throughout it all, they still cared for me. In 2018 my drinking grew so bad that I lost my job and my apartment. I put all my things in storage and one day faced the decision of spending my last bit of money on the monthly fee on my storage unit, or buying some whiskey. I chose the latter.

I lost a lot that day, including letters, photos and other personal items I wish I could get back. I started living on the streets. I lived on the streets for several months until one day my daughter drove down to where I was living. She picked me up and drove me a few blocks to the Rescue Mission. She said, "C'mon dad, we're going in."

I joined the New Life Program that day and found that the program helped me to stay sober. I felt so good about my success I decided to leave the program early. I got a job as a plumber and stayed sober for several months. But, as an almost 60-year-old man, I became more and more aware that plumbing was a

younger man's game. There were 125-degree attics to re-pipe. There were 16-inch vents to squeeze through. I couldn't do the job like I could in my youth and my employer let me go.

I started drinking again and felt hopeless. I couldn't take care of myself. Eventually I was so behind on my rent I walked away from my apartment leaving all my couches, TV, furnishings, etc. behind for the second time.

After hitting rock bottom again, I felt a strong desire to call Don Nicholson, the house manager at the Rescue Mission and plead with him to take me back. I called Don and, after discussing it with the rest of the Rescue Mission staff, he agreed to bring me back to the New Life Program.

I believe my second time on the program has made all the difference. I tell people that the first time I came to the Rescue Mission, my daughter brought me. The second time I came to the Rescue Mission, Jesus brought me.

I think the first time I was here I wasn't ready to let God change me. But now, I have put my trust in Jesus. I have great fellowship at my home church, Calvary Chapel of Salt Lake. I love the teaching of the Bible that happens there and enjoy friendship with the people who attend church and the addiction recovery program there.

Through my church and the counseling I received at the Rescue Mission, I understand that God can forgive everybody, including me. It was hard to accept God's forgiveness and it was hard to forgive myself, but my counselor, George Sproul, helped me to see that by receiving God's forgiveness I could forgive myself. It was like a weight was lifted off my shoulders.

I was nervous when it was time to start the employment phase on the New Life Program but God led me to this great job at Standard Plumbing. This job is something I can do until I want to retire.

I look forward to the future. At the end of this year when I graduate from the New Life Program I will move to the Freedom House, which is the Mission's home for those of us transitioning out of homelessness. I have saved up enough money so I can purchase a car and am working to pay off some of the debts I accumulated over the last few years.

I owe it all to God, who reached down and saved me when I was at my lowest point. Please pray that I would stay connected to my church and recovery meetings. The last time I relapsed it was because I quit going to church and recovery meetings. Please also pray for my middle son. My oldest son and my daughter have families and are doing well, but my middle son is an alcoholic like me. We have tried to get him help, but he is not committed to change yet.

Thank you for supporting the Rescue Mission. Without your support I do not know what my life would be like today. Your support gave me a place that God could lead me to. A place where He knew I could find His people who would love me and help me change.




Obeying Versus Submitting

In a previous devotion on submission we reflected on how

Glenn Beck and David Barton: After Afghanistan, 'Only God Can Save' America

(WOODLAND PARK, Colo)—Christian Newswire/ -- Reports have come from Afghanistan detailing the catastrophic withdrawal of U.S. forces and evacuation of Americans and refugees.

According to conservative commentator and philanthropist Glenn Beck, the United States now finds itself exposed to the world due to the decisions and actions of its leaders.

"We have put ourselves in the most dangerous situation," said Beck. "And I'm telling you, only God can save us now."

Beck and David Barton recently joined the Truth & Liberty Coalition livecast with Andrew Wommack, coalition president, and Richard Harris, executive director, to discuss their recent efforts to rescue refugees from Afghanistan – particularly persecuted Christians.

The Nazarene Fund, founded by Beck, and WallBuilders, founded by Barton, have been working nearly around the clock over the past two weeks to evacuate people from harm's way in Afghanistan. Beck recently appealed to his media audience and raised \$32 million for the privately run rescue efforts.

"We are the people of America, and the people are different than the government," said Beck. "We believe in certain things, and we shouldn't leave people behind, and we certainly shouldn't let people be persecuted for their belief."

According to Beck and Barton, the U.S. State Department's lumbering bureaucracy and gross incompetence led to delays in getting planes into and out of the Kabul airport and having them depart nearly empty.

"I can tell you that they are the biggest hindrance to the saving of Christians or anyone in the Middle East – they have thwarted us at every step of the way," said Beck. "We had a plane up in the air that had permission to land, and as we are in our landing pattern they are told 'Turn them around – you can't land.'"

Beck and Barton said recent events in Afghanistan are symptomatic of a bigger problem.



America's leadership and bureaucracy are threatening our nation's safety and success.

"You've got the Taliban on the outside of the [airport] fence and you've got the State Department on the inside of the fence, so you're fighting two enemies," said Barton.

"The thing I think people need to understand about the process is the government is so large that it is not accountable."

While the Nazarene Fund and WallBuilders are still rescuing Americans and Afghans from danger, when planes land in another country, their work continues. According to Beck, funding goes to evacuation efforts and getting people settled in their new homes, assimilating them into new cultures, and helping them be successful.

"As long as we have the money we will help," added Beck. "We don't want to burden these countries – we want to show them that these people will be a blessing."

According to Harris, "We thank God for the leadership of Glenn Beck and David Barton, as they have accomplished an incredible feat in rescuing thousands of people from the hands of the barbaric Taliban and ISIS-K. The American people must hold the Biden Administration fully accountable for the slaughter that is ensuing in Afghanistan, the surrender of billions of dollars in military equipment, and the immeasurable damage to the security of America and our allies."





My grandchildren referred to him as “Dr. Bud”. He was 85 and still very active in his practice. Recently, a colleague who was considerably younger, described him as a fine doctor and a great surgeon. An active member in his community and past president of AAPS (American Association of Physicians and Surgeons), Dr. Goltry helped lead the way for Idahoans to have medical savings accounts. He was an independent doctor with a strong following and dedicated commitment to giving his patients the best of care. When asked how he kept a successful practice for so many years he was not shy about giving all the credit to God. I did not place you in the Tower that day. You may not know why, but I do.. However, if you were there in that explosive moment in time, would you have reached for Me?

Sept. 11, 2001, was not the end of the journey for you . But someday your journey will end. And I will be there for you as well. Seek Me now while I may be found. Then, at any moment, you know you are 'ready to go.'

I will be in the stairwell of your final moments.

A Brief History of Clergy Appreciation Month

We believe that the concept of clergy appreciation started with the Apostle Paul as he was establishing the first Christian churches. In 1 Timothy, he wrote, "The elders who direct the affairs of the church well are worthy of double honor, especially those whose work is preaching and teaching" (1 Tim. 5:17). And, in 1 Thessalonians, he said, "Respect those who work hard among you, who are over you in the Lord and who admonish you. Hold them in the highest regard in love because of their work" (1 Thess. 5:12-13).

Accordingly, over the centuries, decades and years, pastors have been recognized and honored, either formally or informally, by many denominations and local churches at various times of the year. It has been a long-standing practice.

Focus on the Family named and began emphasizing Clergy Appreciation Month in 1994, reminding congregations that it was biblical and proper to honor their pastoral staffs and pastoral families throughout the year, but suggesting that they set aside the month of October for a special tangible tribute. For those churches that preferred a single weekend, we recommended the second weekend of



the month. However, honoring a church's entire pastoral staff and their families can be done at any time — and, in fact, should become a normal part of a church's ongoing care of these special families throughout the entire year.

Our goal is that every pastor (including staff ministers) and his or her family would feel appreciated by those they serve. To assist congregations in this process, we have developed a planning guide (in both English and Spanish) intended to facilitate and publicize a CAM celebration. We also attempt to promote the concept ourselves each year

through radio, newspapers, magazines and any other means at our disposal.

Over the years, we have been privileged to work in partnership with many publishers, bookstore chains, radio networks, news syndicates, musicians, denominations and other church groups, and have made many friends. Many of these fine organizations promote some form of clergy appreciation on their own. We think this is great! We feel that the fact that no one "owns" the idea of honoring pastors gives the campaign special inertia of its own — or from God.

of harder drugs, and he grew depressed and suicidal. In a desperate attempt to take his own life, he lost his leg. “But that wasn’t even rock bottom,” he says.

He continued his destructive habits until he finally reached the end of his rope.

“I wasn’t eating. I was in a constant state of despair and misery. I was losing my friends and family... and on the verge of becoming homeless.” He reached out to his father who responded with tough love and refused to take him in. Instead, he drove Adam to Wyoming Rescue Mission.

“On the outside I looked like I had it all together, but inside I was in turmoil.”

Adam admits he planned to stay only a few days. “But the classes started to open my eyes,” he says. “I started reading the Bible and listening to other people’s testimonies. Then I knew that I’m not alone in this.”

And when his family called him on Easter Sunday, offering their love and support, he was even more certain he’d made the right decision.

Today, as he continues his transformation in our Discipleship Recovery Program, “God is doing some amazing things in my life,” he says. “He has totally restored my faith and I have an ongoing relationship with Him.”

When he graduates from our care, Adam plans to go wherever the Lord leads him, and he believes that path will take him back to school to become a licensed chemical dependency counselor. “My purpose is to help others as Jesus Christ helped me.”

As Adam celebrates this Thanksgiving, he feels incredibly thankful for your compassion and support – and how it’s given him a fresh start in life. “The Mission has given me hope and excitement to look forward to the future.”

Floyd’s story

“I was addicted to drugs and alcohol for 50 years. I was abusing marijuana, alcohol, and cocaine. Every day was a drink or a drug. That was it. It wasn’t recreational. It was a job. When I got up in the morning, all I thought was, ‘How am I going to get high?’ And it wasn’t fun anymore. It was just a job.”

Floyd’s trouble with alcohol and drugs started at a young age. “I first started smoking marijuana on the weekends before the eighth grade. We had parties, and we’d smoke weed and drink beer and wine.

“When I was 13, my cousin died by drowning. After he passed away, I started drinking and smoking weed every day.” Floyd says what was once a fun weekend activity developed into a lifelong addiction.

Floyd got married when he was 21 and started



having kids. “When we met, my wife and I got along; we liked the same music, and we took it from there. We started seeing each other--you know, going out to movies, out to dinner, like normal people do.”

But Floyd says that drugs and alcohol were also a big part of their relationship. “This was the seventies--a lot of people were drinking alcohol and smoking marijuana. So we did that too.”

When Floyd was drinking, things were bad. “I hurt some people, fighting, because of the alcohol. Normally, I probably would have just let it go. I’m pretty laid back, a happy-go-lucky guy. But, you know, they call whiskey ‘firewater,’ ‘fighting-water,’ and it’s so true.”

Trisha, Floyd’s oldest daughter, shared with us some of her memories of that time. “My dad and I have been separated since I was five years old when my mom decided that it was too unhealthy and too violent for us to stay in Ohio with my dad. So we ended up in California.

“I’ve always wanted to be with my dad. Moving away from him was really hard, and I loved him with all my heart, but even at 5 years old, I knew that we had to go because his drinking was getting out of control. His alcohol abuse made him into a person that just wasn’t who I loved, and we had to leave. But I always wanted my dad, and I never stopped wanting him back in my life.

“When I was 12 years old, my dad came out to visit us. He and my mom were going to try and work things out, but it just didn’t work out. We didn’t have Christ. We didn’t have any kind of spiritual security in our life at that time, and it was a very short-lived situation. He went back to Ohio, and I became very, very sad and depressed. Which God used--He brought me to Him, and I became a Christian. And ever since I was 12 years old, I have prayed with all my heart that God would protect my dad--that He would keep Him safe, He would keep him alive, and would save him.”

At the same time, Trisha says that part of her was also waiting for a call telling her that her dad was gone. Thankfully, that call never came, but some would argue that, even though he was alive, Floyd wasn’t really living during those lonely times. He said, “It was all fine until I started thinking about how I didn’t want to live anymore, or how I had nothing to live for--that was a dark place. No family. No God. Rock bottom.”

In February 2020, Trisha says she went to a fundraising dinner for a drug and alcohol program in Santa Rosa, California. “I just thought about how my dad could go there, and I started to break down and cry. It had been years, and I had never even asked him.”

When Trisha got home, she called her dad and told him about it. And he said he would do it. Then COVID happened. Trisha says, “All the flights were canceled. He couldn’t come, and during that time, he was just stuck. I remember calling him, and he was saying, ‘I just got to get out of here. I just can’t take it anymore.’ And I would tell him, ‘You have to make it. You have to make it!’”

“During that time, we decided to move to Boise, and I didn’t know what was going to happen. But there was a ‘God’ moment! We were at the race track last August, and there was the Rescue Mission’s tent. My little sister was visiting, and I told her we had to go see what they had to offer. It was time, and we

had to help our dad. The staff gave us the information about the New Life Program. I called my dad and got him in contact with Rescue Mission staff right away. So we started the process.”

Floyd says, “We talked about it over the phone, and I said to her, ‘Sure, I’ll try it. How would I get there?’ Trisha and my younger brother bought a ticket, got me on a plane, and flew me to Boise. So, in November of last year, I began the New Life Program here at the Mission.

“I have been sober now for over nine months. For quite a while, I thought the Father had turned His back on me. But, being here, I know better now: He would never turn His back on me, no matter how low I sink. It’s given me a new outlook on life, and it doesn’t seem so hopeless.

“I never thought this would happen. I’ve been



totally blessed. One thing I would say to old friends or people who need help is not to lose hope because the Father hasn’t lost hope in you.”

After 50 years, Floyd and his family are in the process of true reconciliation. Trisha says, “As the months have gone by, we are seeing more and more of him coming out. We get to see his personality.

We’re having a good time. It’s so cool to just watch what God’s doing and how He’s restoring the entire family. Floyd’s wife--my mom--is here as well, and they are working on rebuilding their marriage. God’s restoring that, and they are both getting closer to the Lord, so it’s been good; it’s been really good.

“We go to church together with the family. The kids are like, ‘Mom, we love Grandpa. He’s really funny!’ My dad is changing so much.

It’s just literally been years of prayer-- twenty-five years of prayer--that God has answered in bringing him out here. My dad is finally living life instead of, in his words, ‘just sucking air.’”

“My goal for the future,” Floyd says, “is to grow old and watch my grandchildren grow up and grow older. The Rescue Mission has been very patient with me. It hasn’t been easy dealing with me, and I’m grateful that I’m still here. To those who give to the Mission: I appreciate everything you’ve done and are doing because it’s helped me out immensely. I didn’t have any hope before, but I have hope now.”

Trisha adds, “Thank you so much for giving generously to this ministry that saves and changes lives. It is the most important thing to do with your resources; it is God’s call for us to bring people out of the darkness and into the light. And this is exactly what Boise Rescue Mission Ministries is doing. It’s amazing; I don’t think a single penny is wasted. So thank you so much.”

and the Delta variant, which is wreaking havoc across the world. You were the first to call the pandemic the 'pandemic of the unvaccinated', and that could not be more true. Just about a month ago, I made a very tough decision, a policy decision that Israel would pioneer the booster shot, the third shot. I can report to you, Mr. President, to everyone, that we've reached almost two million Israelis that have received the booster shot, and the bottom line is it's safe and it works. The good news, finally, is that the tide is turning in Israel.

And one last word, Mr. President, you are a man of faith, as I am. In synagogues across the world we read the biblical portion beyond the 'parshah' called the 'haftarah' And tomorrow, we're going to be reading words of the prophet Isaiah [60:3]:

In Hebrew the words are:

קוֹחַרְמָה יִינֵב. דָּל וְאִבּוֹ וְצַבְקָנָה מְלוֹךְ, יֵאָרֶוּ דֵּיִינֵיֶה בִּיבֵס יִאֲשׁוּ׃
הַנְּמֹאת דָּצ לַע דֵּיִיתוֹנְבוֹ וְאוֹבִי׃

What this means is the sons and daughters of the Jewish people are going to come back to our land, are going to nurse our ancient land and rebuild it. This ancient Jewish prophecy is today's reality in Israel. It's a miracle that you've been so central and such a central part of it for so many years.

Mr. President, today you and I – and you've been so generous with your time in these difficult days – you and I are going to write yet another chapter in the beautiful story of the friendship between our two nations, the United States of America and the Jewish and democratic State of Israel. Both of us seek to do good and need to be strong; both of us are a lighthouse in a very, very stormy world.

Thank you, Mr. President. I look forward to working with you now and for many years forward."

states to pray before the start of school. Reports came into toll-free number for days after the first event.

A few months later, a group of youth ministers from all over the country gathered



together for a national conference in Colorado. Many of them reported that their students had heard about the prayer movement in Texas and were equally burdened for their schools. No other events had been planned, but it was clear that students across the country would be creating their own national day of student prayer. There was no stopping them.

On September 11, 1991, at 7:00 a.m., an estimated one million students gathered at school flagpoles all over the country. From Boston, Massachusetts, to Los Angeles, California, from North Dakota to the tip of Texas, students came together to pray. Some sang, some read Scripture, but most importantly, they prayed. Like those first students, they prayed for their schools, for their friends, for their leaders, and for their country.

As in all great movements of prayer, See You at the Pole™ did not begin in the hearts of people. It began in the heart of God. God used the obedience of a

small group of teenagers to ignite what has become an international movement of prayer among young people.


