My challenge to Tucker Carlson to a debate regarding Israel

(BOISE, I'd)—I'm assigned to the White House and State Department press detail to report for the InterMountain Christian News and Israel news service 'Newsrael.'

In light of Podcaster Tucker Carlson's continuous antisemitic anti Israel rhetoric regarding Israel, I need to correct him if I can. Tucker is now supporting a form of antisemitism called Church Replacement Theology in which he lies about The Holy Bible verse Genesis 17:7 regarding the covenant of GOD with Abraham and his descendants Isaac and Jacob [Jacob is later renamed Israel by GOD]. Tucker lies about that Genesis scripture by saying GOD's covenant was now with Christians instead. But that verse does not say that and GOD says His Covenant is an everlasting covenant to Abraham and his descendants. Tucker is totally wrong Biblically, Christians are NOT Biblical Israel. I would ask Tucker the following question: If Christians replaced Israel, why was the ancestral land of Israel given

History of the GOD and Country Festival of the Treasure Valley

The God and Country Festival began during a movement organized by western actor Chuck Connors during the sixties to promote our country's founding ideals and faith in God.

Our Legacy: Honoring Faith, Family, and Freedom Since 1966

The God and Country Family Festival has a rich and inspiring history, rooted in patriotism, faith, and community. It all began in 1966, when beloved western film and television star Chuck Connors—best known for his role in *The Rifleman*—helped spearhead a nationwide movement of patriotic rallies and parades aimed at uniting communities under shared American values.

Connors believed deeply in preserving the principles on which our nation was founded and used his platform to inspire events that blended civic pride with a strong faith-based foundation. One of the earliest of these rallies took place right here in Nampa, Idaho. That first event was held on the Wednesday night before Independence Day in 1966, laying the foundation for what would become a cherished local tradition.

As time went on, the original parade—now called Parade America—shifted to the third Saturday in May. But the heart of the original vision remained alive through what became known as the God and Country Rally, continuing the patriotic and spiritual celebration on its original midweek date. This event became a beacon for those who believed in keeping both God and country central to American life.

In 2000, the growing crowds and community enthusiasm prompted a move from Lakeview Park to the Ford Idaho Center Amphitheater. With that transition came a new name: the God and Country Family Festival—a name that reflects not only our values but the generations of families who attend year after year.

Today, the festival remains one of the last surviving God and Country-style rallies in the nation, a living legacy to Chuck Connors' vision and to the dedication of those who have worked tirelessly to keep it going. It continues to be a FREE community celebration held on the traditional Wednesday before the 4th of July, featuring music, speakers, military and civic honors, and a grand fireworks display provided by the City of Nampa.

At its core, the God and Country Family Festival is a tribute to the enduring ideals of our nation's founders, honoring active-duty military, veterans, public servants, first responders, and the unshakable foundation of faith that binds us together.

Join us as we carry this legacy forward—for God, for country, and for the generations to come.



Chuck Connors: Athlete, Actor, Patriot
Best known as *The Rifleman*, Chuck Connors stood 6'5" and had a rare career as a two-sport pro athlete, playing for the Brooklyn Dodgers and the Boston Celtics.

Before acting, he served in the U.S. Army during WWII and later rose to fame as Lucas McCain, one of TV's first single fathers, teaching moral lessons in the Wild West.

In the 1960s, Connors called on communities to hold patriotic rallies to support American troops. Nampa's God and Country Rally was among the first to respond—helping launch a legacy that still thrives today.

A proud American, Connors was even a guest at the White House and once gifted a cowboy hat to Soviet leader Leonid Brezhnev during a diplomatic dinner.

Idaho Library Hellbent on Breaking Law Intended to Protect Children

We travel across the state regularly—and if there’s one thing we hear from parents more often than anything else, it’s their exasperation that some libraries are seemingly hellbent on peddling pornography to children.

That’s why Idaho Family Policy Center researched and drafted the Children’s School and Library Protection Act (CSLPA). This law requires public schools and community libraries to take reasonable steps to ensure children don’t stumble upon obscene materials while browsing library collections.

It’s simple for libraries to comply with the law. They only need to store sexually explicit materials in a locked room or at the front counter—places that children can’t access.

This was all too much for the Donnelly Public Library, who announced that they would convert into an “adult-only” library soon after the law was adopted.

Their malicious compliance – prohibiting children from entering the library without a parent – went far beyond the “reasonable steps” required by the CSLPA.

But now the Donnelly Public Library has turned their stubbornness into something more sinister.

Idaho Family Policy Center recently received a tip that the Donnelly Public Library is now offering blanket consent waivers disguised as “patron applications” that allow children to access obscene materials without parental supervision.

We obtained one of these patron applications through a public records request—and you won’t believe what it contains:

- The library acknowledges that their collection contains “adult content” (read: pornography) and that children may stumble across “grown-up library materials.” Aren’t euphemisms great?
- Even worse? The library insists that librarians aren’t able to review every book in their collection and that they “are not responsible for the content” of library items—despite having that legal duty under the CSLPA.
- Worst of all? Parents who want their children to check out library books must “waive [their] right(s)” to the legal remedies

available to them under the CSLPA.

All this begs the question: Why is the Donnelly Public Library so desperate to distribute obscene materials to children?

Regardless of their motive, one thing is certain—these patron application forms are patently illegal.

Here’s the truth: The CSLPA doesn’t allow libraries to sidestep liability by obtaining blanket consent waivers from parents. Unless a parent is physically present with the child when they access obscene materials, a library has violated the law and could be liable for damages—regardless of any prior waiver.

How low will these libraries stoop to give porn to kids? It’s a real race to the bottom—and the Donnelly Library is taking a decisive lead.

But seriously. These libraries think they can break the law without suffering consequences.

It’s time to hold them accountable—and we plan to make sure that happens. Keep your eyes peeled.

Supreme Court to hear arguments over Colorado religious discrimination, Catholic preschools

WASHINGTON (BP) – The Supreme Court announced on Monday (April 20) that it will not reconsider its landmark 1990 religious freedom decision that lower courts cited in a Colorado dispute over Catholic preschools and LGBTQ families, but it will hear arguments over how that ruling applies in the case.

Employment Division v. Smith framed such cases over religious exemptions, and when they should be applied in cases involving religious freedom.

A 2022 Colorado law creating a “universal” preschool program that funds up to 15 hours of free preschool at any public or licensed private school requires those schools to include all children and parents, regardless of characteristics such as sexual orientation and gender identity. St. Mary Catholic Parish, based in Littleton, requires families to uphold the sincere religious beliefs of the school.

Catholic preschools from the Denver Archdiocese, including St. Mary Catholic Parish, filed a federal lawsuit in August 2023. In January 2024, a federal district court generally upheld the state’s position, calling the nondiscrimination measure neutral and not in violation of the First Amendment. That decision was upheld last September by the U.S. Court of Appeals for the 10th Circuit.

At the end of March, the Supreme Court upheld a Colorado Christian counselor’s right to free speech regarding counseling clients with LGBTQ issues.

“Once again, the state of Colorado will appear before the Supreme Court, asking justices to endorse its latest effort to discriminate against religious people,” said Miles Mullin, Ethics & Religious Liberty Commission chief of staff. “Colorado did not have to create a universal pre-school program,

but when it did, it had a legal obligation to include religious preschools in that program – even those that hold to a biblical sexual ethic that its lawmakers do not like.”

He went on to call the action “religious bigotry” that “violates the First Amendment, ignores over 10 years of Constitutional case law and enshrines religious discrimination in law.”

The ERLC joined an amicus brief alongside the National Association of Evangelicals and others in support of St. Mary Catholic Parish. Although the Colorado preschool program is “universal” in name, the brief argues that the law is not so in reality, as long as it excludes religious groups.

The brief noted that the lower court’s decision is “hardly the only case” where the

Smith decision has been used to discriminate against those with religious beliefs, citing Masterpiece Cakeshop, *Fulton v. Philadelphia* and *Agudath Israel of America v. Cuomo*. It also included language from the original petition that “Religious people across the country are stuck in forever conflicts precisely because of the (sometimes willful) confusion among the lower courts over the meaning of the Free Exercise Clause.”

Colorado has “no right to impose penalties for religious opinions,” said Mullin, adding that “God alone is the Lord of the conscience.”

“Although the freedom to practice one’s religion is guaranteed by the Constitution, it is a God-given right that is recognized in the First Amendment, not granted by it,” he said. “The right to practice one’s religion is a prepolitical, first freedom that must be defended, which is why the ERLC submitted a brief urging the court to hear this case and looks forward to submitting an additional brief arguing the merits of the case.”

Utah, Idaho youth events use sports to share hope

MONTICELLO, Utah – A small Utah church scored an evangelistic coup that spread to two states in late April.

Youth director Erin Barry at First Baptist Church of Monticello, southeastern Utah, knows a world champion extreme snowboarder-turned-evangelist, and invited him to speak to students April 19-24. Tom Gillis accepted and brought three-time Olympic Gold Medalist (in softball) and motivational speaker Leah Amico with him.

“Tom had an encounter with God at my dad’s church in Lake Tahoe in 2003, and was saved soon after,” Barry told Baptist Press. “We saw each other last fall and I asked him. We’ve been planning this since October. We have been seeing God move throughout our area recently. In Dove Creek, [Colo.,] a third of the middle/high school students are attending FCA [Fellowship of Christian athletes] at times on Tuesday for lunch and a Bible lesson.

“We want to see more kids come to Christ,”

continued Barry, bivocational as the volleyball coach at Dove Creek High School. “Tom and Leah have a great passion for evangelism and can reach kids through sports. We spent the week traveling to local schools, doing assemblies, meeting with softball teams and FCA Huddles.”

Those schools are in Monticello and Blanding, Utah, and in Dove Creek, Dolores and Durango, Colo. Monticello’s population: 1,722; Blanding: 3,280; Durango: 19,811; Dolores: 958; and Dove Creek, 676.

“Tom told his stories, how God changed his life, and Leah, how overcoming adversity led her to three gold medals,” Barry said.

Gilles holds the world’s record for extreme snowboarding’s quarter-pipe drop-in. While a straight-arrow athlete in high school, his life took a turn when he got into professional snowboarding. He began

drinking and using drugs.

The Utah Idaho Southern Baptist Convention [UISBC] gave a “substantial grant” to the project, Barry said, adding that his church covered the rest.

“First Baptist Church of Monticello could not do ‘The Gold Standard and Rad Assemblies’ without outside assistance from the Utah-Idaho Southern Baptist Convention and the [North American Mission Board] evangelism grant,” said Rob Lee, executive director of the UISBC. “The beauty of partnering is that the church could do far more than it could on its own and capitalize on the Winter Olympics in February.

“The church runs around 40 to 60 on most Sundays and has always had a big vision to engage its community with the Gospel,” Lee continued. “They started a radio station many years ago under the leadership of their former pastor, John Williams, which ended up broadcasting the high school sports events for the community, opening the church’s doors to the school.”

Over the last 18 months, First Monticello has helped restart another church in Gideon Baptist Association, “so I know their passion for making a kingdom impact in their region,” Lee continued. “Without our partnership, many of these God-sized events would not have been possible at the level their church leaders had dreamed of.”

Gilles and Amico spoke to 760 students throughout the week, who because of their location probably had never before heard an evangelistic message from top athletes, Dove Creek FCA leader Donella Fury told Baptist Press. At least 160 of the students indicated they had “some sort of encounter with God,” Barry said.

The First Monticello youth first met with Gilles Sunday night at youth group.

“I encouraged them to be expectant and by Friday night they got more and more excited,” Gilles told Baptist Press. “The fact they were sharing their faith was really cool. [It was] Faith in action. The really cool thing is how excited they were to see God move!”

Gilles spoke Tuesday in Dove Creek,

Colo., at an FCA Huddle and at an all-school assembly. Wednesday Gilles spoke with 120 students at the Durango, Colo., FCA Huddle, where “When Tom gave an altar call, every student went forward,” Barry said. Later that day, Gilles and Amico spoke at a night of worship and prayer with members of First Monticello.

“Thursday morning, they spoke to all the elementary, middle school and high school students in Dolores, and then traveled to Monticello where they spoke at an all-school assembly at the high school,” Barry said. “Leah went to softball practice and spoke with Monticello’s team. Then she went to softball practice in Blanding and spoke with their team.

“On Friday night we hosted a worship and story event where Leah and Tom shared their stories and presented the Gospel to more than 100 students and parents,” the Monticello youth director continued. “Throughout the week we had the opportunity to pray with atheists, Muslims, Mormons and everyone in between. They weren’t making professions of faith, but they heard truth and that affected them.”

Gilles said, “I saw kids super hungry for God’s Word but not experiencing it. ... They just want the raw truth and they need it. When truth hits them, they react.”

Fury described the events in Dove Creek school for those in grades 6-12.

“At lunch it was definitely Scripture-based and Christ-focused,” Fury said. “We prayed for the assembly and [Gilles] asked

each of the kids to pray for one person specifically. At the assembly he kept it very politically correct. He didn’t come out and say Jesus was the reason for the changes in his life but he quoted Bible verses [without their scriptural addresses]. He was just talking about kids’ choices, suggesting good choices in friends, in habits, in everything they do, and don’t compromise!”

Gilles was the “Rad” part of the week’s title. Amico, the “Gold standard.”

“I challenge students to take ownership of their future by following the best MAP for success: Mindset: Believing in yourself and embracing challenges as opportunities; Action: Taking intentional steps toward your goals every single day; and People: Surrounding yourself with those who push you to be your best,” Amico says on her website.

“At assembly, my and the students’ favorite part was the connection [Gilles] made with them. He said he told them his story and wanted theirs,” Fury said. “He passed out paper and told them to write their name and grade, and one thing they were dealing with, and said he would read all the papers before he left the school.

“It was so neat to watch the kids write and write and write. Some took 10 to 15 minutes writing,” Fury continued. “There was not a single student who did not take their paper down front. It was so touching, really amazing to see. We’ve never had anything like this before.”

Wyoming witness: Baptism and evangelism numbers increase at record rates

CASPER (BP) – Its distinction as the country’s least populous state can factor into the tendency to overlook Wyoming. Doing so, however, means missing a response to the Gospel that is both indicative of the ministry work there, as well as what is achievable anywhere else.

“We’ve seen a 100 percent increase in baptisms from 2023 to 2025, so we’re praising God for that. We also just had a wonderful Youth Evangelism Conference with Shane Pruitt as our speaker,” said Rondie Taylor,

state executive. “That brought a record attendance of 300 students and leaders. With over a third of our churches there, we saw at least 30 professions of faith with many rededications and responses to a ministry calling.”

Taylor, who has been in his role for two-and-a-half years, pointed to those who have bought in on the importance of sharing the Gospel.

“Our pastors and churches have really invested in evangelism,” he said.

Those results, Taylor added, are coming from a variety of ministry contexts. Hispanic churches are reporting growth, as are college and youth ministries. Outreach efforts in prisons are bringing fruit as well.

“It’s in every kind of church, and we’re seeing that play out with youth and events like YEC,” Taylor said.

The previous attendance mark for Wyoming’s YEC was 200. There were 225

baptisms recorded in the state in 2023. In 2025, that figure jumped to 450.

Pruitt, the North American Mission Board's Next Gen director, spoke on April 17 and later shared on social media his excitement over the number of salvations, asking others to join him in prayer over the new believers.

In another post the next day, he encouraged youth leaders to ditch "fluff and puff" Bible teaching when it comes to students.

"They want Spirit and Truth," he said. "They are hungry for truth, so preach the Bible. Let the Scriptures dictate the topic. Let the Scriptures dictate the illustrations. Let the Scriptures dictate the application. Teach the Word of God."

Taylor said the events in Wyoming reflect what is possible elsewhere.

"Our youth leaders are excited about the trends we're seeing across the country. Students are interested in spiritual things, and the Gospel is the answer. They're answering the call to ministry and inviting their friends [to events and church]."

The state has revamped an intentional investment in youth and children's ministry, he noted. Three youth camps – including one focused on missions – join another week for children at the Mountain Top Baptist Assembly Camp outside of Casper.

Taylor's wife, Melody, has taken the lead in developing events for children and training for volunteers. Ed Tharp, a longtime student and collegiate pastor in Casper who now serves there as senior pastor at Boyd Avenue Baptist, has remained active in similar leadership and guidance for student events. Reuben Marlow, pastor of Living Hope Church in Green River, and others have taken similar roles.

Breakout sessions during YEC for youth

leaders reflect ongoing efforts across the state to resource ministers. For 20 years, Gateway Seminary has offered training for pastors and student ministers online as well as in person.

"A lot of our youth leaders get trained in all aspects of ministry and theology," said Taylor. "A third of our pastors have gone through the advanced seminary program that Gateway offers."

"We're seeing results from all over the state. I credit our pastors, churches and their evangelistic efforts. We're seeing the results play out."

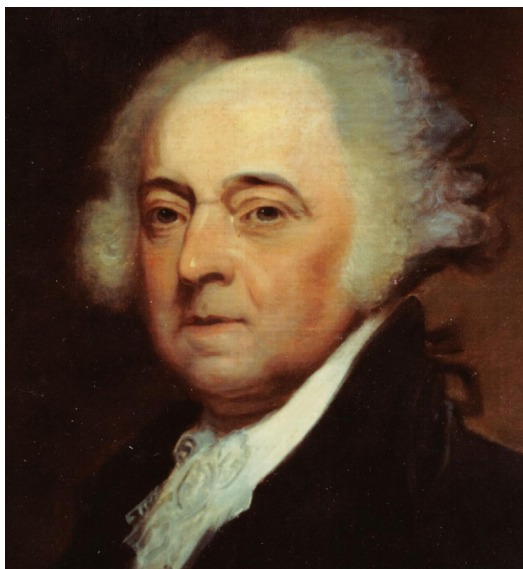

The general principles on which the fathers achieved independence were the general principles of Christianity.

I will avow that I then believed, and now believe, that those general principles of Christianity are as eternal and immutable as the existence and attributes of God.1

The Holy Ghost carries on the whole Christian system in this earth. Not a baptism, not a marriage, not a sacrament can be administered but by the Holy Ghost. . . . There is no authority, civil or religious – there can be no legitimate government but what is administered by this Holy Ghost. There can be no salvation without it. All without it is rebellion and perdition, or in more orthodox words damnation.2

Without religion, this world would be something not fit to be mentioned in polite company: I mean hell.3

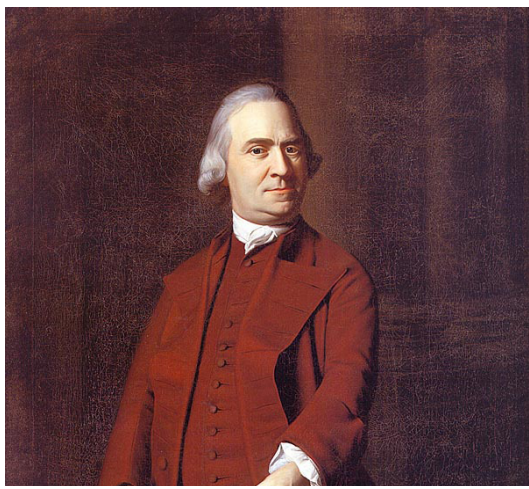

The name of the Lord (says the Scripture) is a strong tower; thither the righteous flee and are safe [Proverbs 18:10]. Let us secure His favor and He will lead us through the journey of this life and at length receive us to a better.¹¹

I conceive we cannot better express ourselves than by humbly supplicating the Supreme Ruler of the world . . . that the confusions that are and have been among the nations may be overruled by the promoting and speedily bringing in the holy and happy period when the kingdoms of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ may be everywhere established, and the people willingly bow to the scepter of Him who is the Prince of Peace.¹²

He also called on the State of Massachusetts to pray that . . .

* the peaceful and glorious reign of our Divine Redeemer may be known and enjoyed throughout the whole family of mankind.¹³

* we may with one heart and voice humbly implore His gracious and free pardon through Jesus Christ, supplicating His Divine aid . . . [and] above all to cause the religion of Jesus Christ, in its true spirit, to spread far and wide till the whole earth shall be filled with His glory.¹⁴

* with true contrition of heart to confess their sins to God and implore forgiveness through the merits and mediation of Jesus Christ our Savior.¹⁵



Josiah Bartlett (November 21, 1729 – May 19, 1795)

Let us enter on this important business under the idea that we are Christians on whom the eyes of the world are now turned. . . . [L]et us earnestly call and beseech Him, for Christ’s sake, to preside in our councils. . . . We can only depend on the all powerful influence of the Spirit of God, Whose Divine aid and assistance it becomes us as a Christian people most devoutly to implore. Therefore I move that some minister of the Gospel be requested to attend this Congress every morning . . . in order to open the meeting with prayer.¹⁸

A letter to his daughter:

You have been instructed from your childhood in the knowledge of your lost state by nature – the absolute necessity of a change of heart and an entire renovation of soul to the image of Jesus Christ – of salvation through His meritorious righteousness only – and the indispensable necessity of personal holiness without which no man shall see the Lord [Hebrews 12:14]. You are well acquainted that the most perfect and consummate doctrinal knowledge is of no avail without it operates on and sincerely affects the heart, changes the practice, and totally influences the will – and that without the almighty power of the Spirit of God enlightening your mind, subduing your will, and continually drawing you to Himself, you can do nothing. . . . And may the God of your parents (for many generations past) seal instruction to your soul and lead you to Himself through the blood of His too greatly despised Son, Who notwithstanding, is still reclaiming the world to God through that blood, not imputing to them their sins. To Him be glory forever!¹⁹

For nearly half a century have I anxiously and critically studied that invaluable treasure [the Bible]; and I still scarcely ever take it up that I do not find something new – that I do not receive some valuable addition to my stock of knowledge or perceive some instructive fact never observed before. In short, were you to ask me to recommend the most valuable book in the world, I should fix on the Bible as the most instructive both to the wise and ignorant. Were you to ask me for one affording the most rational and pleasing entertainment to the inquiring mind, I should repeat, it is the Bible; and should you renew the inquiry for the best philosophy or the most interesting history, I should still urge you to look into your Bible. I would make it, in short, the Alpha and Omega of knowledge.²⁰

Merger brings new building space, momentum to Utah church plant

FRUIT HEIGHTS, Utah – It’s getting increasingly difficult for church plants across the nation to find a suitable, low-cost place to meet on Sunday mornings. But King’s Cross Church had one handed to it in Davis County, a growing northern suburb of Salt Lake City.

The building belonged to a dying church and came complete with a congregation, one of two that have joined with the three-year-old church plant that plans to plant two additional churches over the next two years.

“God’s grace. It’s humbling,” Pastor Austin Glenn told Baptist Press. “It’s crazy to think of God’s kindness towards us.”

What the Glenn couple – and now the church – have done could be called “relationship-building on steroids.”

Sent in 2021 by Church at the Cross in Grapevine, Texas, the Glenn family (that today includes five homeschooled youngsters between 2 and 10) went through Send Network’s assessment process after spending a year at a church previously started by Church at the Cross in Grapevine. Send Network is the North American Mission Board’s (NAMB) church planting arm.

Then they moved to Farmington, in Davis County, Utah, north of Salt Lake City, and started First Friday Grill and Chill at their home. They built a launch team that met for Bible study and became involved in various service projects to become known in the community: backpack drive, park cleanups, gift bags for the 1,000 teachers and staff members in Farmington, and free water bottles during the town’s Festival Days.

“We adopted LifePoint Church, another small Southern Baptist church in Farmington,” Glenn recounted. “It was basically five families. The church had been going about eight years and hadn’t gotten a lot of traction. After a year of semi-regular lunches, the pastor [Brent Van Sickle] asked me, ‘What do you think about us joining you?’ Brent now serves as pastor for outreach and missions at King’s Cross.”

LifePoint, which closed in December 2022, had participated in pre-launch meetings for Kings Cross, which launched on March 5, 2023, with 25 adults and 24 youngsters. The new church plant met Sundays at Ascent

Academy charter school.

“We wanted to do youth activities, women’s groups, men’s breakfasts and the like when the Academy wasn’t available. We reached out to Mountain Road Church – it was about seven minutes away – to ask if we could rent their building,” Glenn said. “They said, ‘It’s not for rent, but you can borrow it.’ We started including them in the different things we were doing.”

Mountain Road Church, which had started in 1982, gave its property and joined Kings Cross Church in December 2024. Then came fundraising for the renovations Kings Cross wanted to make, including expanding the 150-seat worship center to its current 280-seat capacity. About \$750,000 was quickly pledged “by internal and external sources,” Glenn said.

“We gave the whole place a facelift,” the pastor said. “Literally everything was touched. A big expense was fire sprinklers: \$250,000 for that alone.”

Josh Gardner, King’s Cross Church’s director of discipleship and development, also is a NAMB-endorsed church planting apprentice who anticipates planting a church in North Salt Lake in February 2027. At this time, he is developing a launch team and raising support. King’s Cross anticipates being the sending church.

King’s Cross also plans to launch Ukrainian Living Hope Church in August 2026 with Oleh Kamanov serving as the planter. He recently completed the NAMB assessment process. The Ukrainian group moved their Bible studies from people’s homes to the church once renovations were completed in early March. One man who recently started attending the weekly Bible study is an experienced worship leader.

On the Saturday before Easter, April 4, about 50 children and their parents heard a clear Gospel message by Pastor Oleh, along with a puppet show in Ukrainian that told the story of two pirates who are moved by the true story of Easter. A family Easter egg hunt came next. At least 60 Ukrainians participated in the event.

“We talk a lot about being a people sent

on mission, and I think our people really embody that culture of evangelism,” Glenn said. “We’re pretty traditional. We have communion every Sunday. We don’t have a rock band.

“We do have a commitment to Gospel centrality in preaching and preach 40- to 60-minute sermons,” the pastor continued. “We dive deeply into the text. Our folks seem to like it. They really want to know what the Bible says.”

March 1, the first service in the renovated 13,000-square-foot building on four acres of land a bit northeast of Farmington, drew a near-maximum 252 people. Easter Sunday five weeks later drew 347 people total to two services and included three baptisms, all recent believers who left Mormonism and are being disciplined through ministries at King’s Cross Church.

“As Henry Blackaby told Southern Baptists, ‘Find out where God is moving and join Him in the work,’” Glenn said. “That’s Utah. In ways like never before, God is drawing people unto Himself here, and it is a joy to partner with Him in the work.”

Montana’s new exec gets to work

BILLINGS, Mont. – Mikey Mewborn, vice president of student life at Mid-America Baptist Theological Seminary, recently accepted a call as executive director/treasurer of the Montana Southern Baptist Convention. A friend’s connection, meetings with Montana Baptists and even a few family ski trips helped solidify Mewborn’s heart for the West.

Mewborn, who earned a Ph.D. in practical theology from MABTS in 2014, also is dean of students and chairman of the theology and church history division at the Memphis, Tenn., seminary.

“Mikey brings together the heart of a pastor, the mind of a theologian and the experience of a leader who loves the local church,” said Greg Payton, pastor of The Rock Church in Laurel, Mont., and chairman of the executive director search committee. “Montana Baptists were not simply looking for someone to fill a position. We were asking God to give us a leader who would love our pastors, strengthen our churches and help us reach Montana with the Gospel. We believe God has answered that prayer.”

Mewborn follows Barrett Duke, previously a vice president at the Southern Baptist Convention’s Ethics & Religious Liberty Commission. Duke served nine years as Montana’s executive director and retired to Maryland last year.

Now 47, Mewborn has been in ministry for 26 years, with stints in children, youth and college ministries and served 18 years in Florida, Mississippi and Tennessee pastorates prior to joining the faculty at Mid-America Seminary in 2018. There he taught undergraduate and master’s level courses in systematic theology, biblical preaching, pastoral ministry, leadership development, church ministry, history of the Baptists, and religion in the public square.

He taught soteriology, Christology and eschatology at the doctoral level.

"I want to inspire and encourage pastors who are in the Gospel ministry," Mewborn said. "That's really what I want to do. I want to encourage, inspire and get them resources they need to succeed in their places of ministry."

To that end, he has already heard from the Mid-South Baptist Association in Tennessee, which includes 170 churches. At its recent executive board meeting, the association voted to enter a partnership with Montana.

"Mitch Martin [the association's executive director] served the Utah-Idaho Convention for several years," Mewborn said. "That's why when he heard I was going to Montana he said, 'Mikey, the West has a huge place in my heart.' The Mid-South Association doesn't necessarily want to send church planters. They want to come alongside current churches and strengthen them."

The Memphis, Tenn., area is a hard place to minister, Mewborn said, and Mid-South Baptist Association's Southern Baptist churches have learned what it takes to thrive despite a variety of challenges.

The new executive director said he has already observed – from Zoom calls, an on-site meeting last December with the search committee, and subsequent meetings before and since he was elected at a specially called business session at MPact in March – that Montana Southern Baptist pastors and leaders "are extremely hardworking. They're spread out across a huge state and have limited resources for ministry. We must work together to bring revival to our amazing state."

"I feel like the Lord has prepared me for this opportunity," Mewborn continued. "When it comes to practical things, we are going to call out the called and train up ministers for the Gospel ministry. I hope to provide ample support for our seasoned churches as well as church plants. I'm deeply focused on coming alongside and encouraging our Montana pastors."

Montana Southern Baptist Convention President Curtis Crow said the vote reflected both confidence in Mewborn and unity among Montana Baptists.

"Throughout this process, there was a clear desire to seek the Lord, listen carefully and move forward together," Crow said. "Dr. Mewborn's love for Scripture, commitment to evangelism and desire to encourage pastors make him a strong fit for this season in Montana Baptist life."

The West has been in his heart for at least nine years, Mewborn said. He and his wife Emily – together they parent three children under age 8 – have traveled to Park City, Utah, the last 17 winters for what they were told was "the best snow on earth."

Those ski trips often included preaching and teaching opportunities, and nine years ago a Utah pastor said to Mewborn, "Man, you ever felt a call on your life for the West?"

The couple prayed about it, and God showed them it wasn't time.

Early in 2025, Montana pastor Jim Taber was talking with his longtime friend in Florida – JJ Johnson – about Duke retiring, and the search for a new executive director in Montana. That friend was Mewborn's high school youth pastor.

He suggested Taber call Mewborn, who demurred. "I'm telling you, you need to call him!" Johnson said.

"Well, he called me, and we instantly had a kindred heart for ministry," Mewborn said.

"We became great friends on the phone."

Taber suggested, and then encouraged, Mewborn to come to Montana for a looksee, to preach, and to submit his resume.

"As soon as I arrived in Billings, I knew God had called us to Montana," Mewborn said. "I was overjoyed to feel God moving us in this direction."

Five months later, the search team and executive board held an onsite meeting in Helena, Mont. "As the pastors began to speak and ask me questions, it was obvious that this was where I was supposed to serve, and these were the people I wanted to serve alongside," the new executive director said.

Mewborn plans to move to Montana July 1.

"My greatest desire is to see people come to know the Lord Jesus Christ on a personal level," Mewborn said. "Whether in the classroom, the pulpit or now serving alongside Montana Baptists, I want to help people read, believe and live the Word of God. I am humbled by the trust Montana Baptists have placed in me, and I am excited to serve pastors and churches as we work together to make Christ known across this state."

(BOISE, Id)—My long time Pastor friend John Higgins and instrumental JESUS People movement leader passed away on June 3, 2026.

According to a recent Calvary Chapel Magazine article (June 5, 2026), "Pastor Higgins was a close friend of Calvary Chapel founding Pastpr Chuck Smith and introduced the well known Hippie

Lonnie Frisbee to Pastor Chuck. Pastor John along with Lonnie Frisbee helped established and led the early "House of Miracles" in 1968 for young hippies. In the

early 1970s John Higgins and core members of the House of Miracles started the Shiloh Ministries Christian communes," the largest of JESUS People communal houses in U.S. history with the establishment of 175 houses throughout the United States and their headquarters in Dexter, Oregon on 90 acres called "The Land," of which I was a part of off and on from 1970-1975.

I lived in the Shiloh Ministries house in Idaho Falls, Idaho January of 1971 with the house leaders George and Debby Bryson and lived and worked briefly in the Shiloh University House in Eugene, Oregon the Summer of 1975. During that time period

I was close with Shiloh member and Auto Mechanic Don Nelson at "The Land." There were Shiloh houses in our InterMountain state areas of Idaho, Colorado and throughout the United States.

Pastor John in his later years served as the senior pastor at Calvary Chapel Tri-City in the Tempe-Phoenix, Arizona area where I was invited to speak about Israel and my White House reporting experiences about Israel at a Calvary Chapel Pastors conference held January 25, 2019. I was so blessed to stay with brother Pastor John and his wife Shauna

IFPC Board Chairman Israel Waitman read Deuteronomy 3 – 4, in which God reminds His people of just how important it is that they follow His law.

- IFPC Advisory Board Chairman Jim Davis read Numbers 31 – 32, in which God provides the Israelites with directions on how they were to displace the Canaanites.

The America Reads the Bible event shows that more and more American Christians are waking up to the fact that our nation was great only because the Bible was once at the heart of everything we did.

Let's be praying that God revives us again—and that the Bible once again becomes the guidebook for all of life, including politics and government!

Boise School District is breaking the law – again!

Over the last couple years, we've seen too many local governments in Idaho decide that following the law is optional. From Boise City Hall continuing to fly its Pride flag to dozens of school districts refusing to comply with state law regarding radical gender instruction, it seems that some local governments simply act as if the law doesn't apply to them.

And then there's Boise School District. First, they gave express permission for biological men to use girls' bathrooms in violation of our school bathroom law—resulting in the IFPC Legal Center filing a lawsuit against the district on behalf of a teenage girl whose privacy was violated.

If that weren't enough, Boise School District is now refusing to provide instruction that affirms the value of preborn

human life—despite state law requiring such instruction.

Here's the backstory: Last year, the Idaho legislature adopted its Baby Olivia law that mandates instruction for middle and high school students on prenatal development. The law is named after the Baby Olivia educational video, which was produced by LiveAction and illustrates how a baby develops inside the womb.

So imagine our surprise when we learned that Boise School District sent an email telling parents that teachers couldn't show the video!

How does Boise School District justify ignoring the Baby Olivia law? They say that another state law requiring parental opt-in for woke sexuality instruction prevents them from discussing prenatal development.

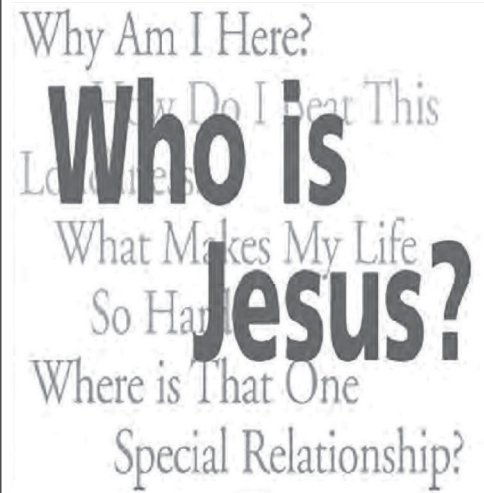
Now you probably don't see any conflict between these two laws. Basic biology and fetal development are clearly different from woke sexuality instruction—and even Idaho law makes this obvious distinction.

It does make you wonder: What does Boise School District find so scary about providing their students with a scientific perspective on human development in the womb? Maybe Boise School District just doesn't want their students to learn that preborn babies are developing human persons who deserve the same rights as everyone else?

Whatever their reasoning, Boise School District believes that they can pick and choose which laws they're bound to respect. And when it comes to leftist indoctrination, nothing seems to stop them.

This must end. In the coming weeks, we'll announce our plans to expose any school district that acts like they're above the law.

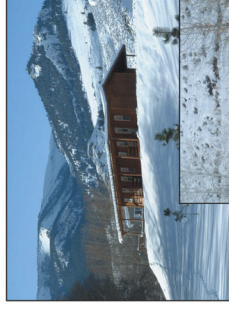
