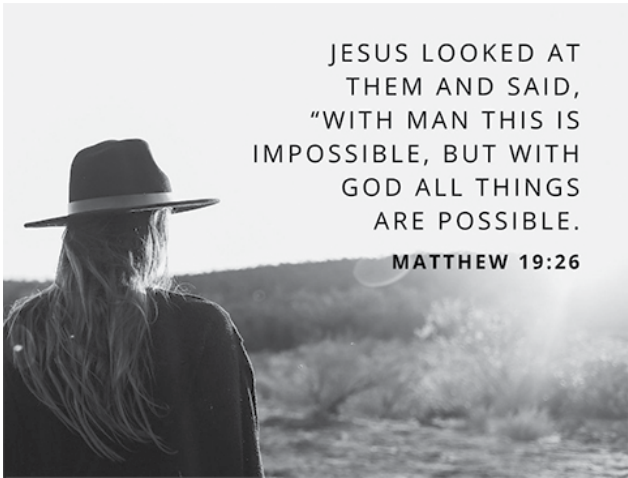

White House reporter’s chief complaint was of the Press Secretary Jennifer Psaki or her Deputy Press Secretary Karine Jean-Pierre paying attention primarily to the first two front rows of reporters, basically ignoring the majority

of reporters in the remaining five rows. The layout of the press room consists of seven rows of chairs with seven chairs per row. You will see me standing up in this protest meeting along the wall on the left hand side near the front. A Day of Prayer and Repentance 2022

March 12, 2022

(BOISE, Id)--Saturday, March 12, saw a group of committed Idahoans – augmented by people flying in from a half dozen states to support them – gathered on the steps of the state capitol in Boise for a day of Prayer and Repentance. The event was organized by Rep Heather Scott, a Republican representing Bouny and Bonner Counties, the northern tip of Idaho. The group numbered about a hundred at the state capitol while another crowd of about two hundred gathered to pray before St Luke’s Medical Center Boise.

Though Idahoans chafe under an escalating cycle of injustice facilitated by Gov Brad Little’s now two-year-old state of emergency, the prayer event was energized by a shared conviction that “If my people, called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face, and turn from evil, I will hear from heaven and forgive their sin and heal their land.” The theme of 2 Chronicles 7:14 was echoed repeatedly throughout the three-hour service of prayer and repentance Saturday.

Rep Scott said she conceived the idea in conversation with Deputy Senior Archbishop Alex Mwaluma, of Kennewick, Washington, when he called to invite her to such an occasion planned for the national capitol in the near future. When she invited him to participate in a repentance day in Boise he signed on. In the event, he was accompanied by his Senior Archbishop Louis Lupo and numerous colleagues. All spoke and prayed at the event, as well as providing leadership in the worship surrounding it.

Rep Scott later commented, “It was a privilege and an honor to host the Idaho Day of Prayer and Repentance at the Boise State Capitol. What an inspiring display of faith, commitment, and love for our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. It was very humbling to watch so many people from diverse ethnicity and culture praying for our state and our country. My hope is that repentance for our nation spreads to the other forty-nine states and Washington DC and beyond.”

Local pastors participating included the Revs James Wilson, Craig Hanson, Luke Davidson, and Benji Graves. Craig Hanson summarized the feeling shared by all, saying, “My faith was encouraged and my heart was filled with joy to see Christians from around the USA join Idahoans at the Idaho State Capitol for a day of prayer for repentance to reveal and remove the sins of our lives and America.”

One speaker acknowledged Americans understanding themselves as victims more than perpetrators of sin. Having once lost a job for having done something right, he said when God called on him to repent he protested, “But I did nothing wrong,” to which God replied, “Until you re-focus your attention on me – repentance – you’ve done nothing right.” Apparently the privilege of repentance is always the remedy – no exceptions.

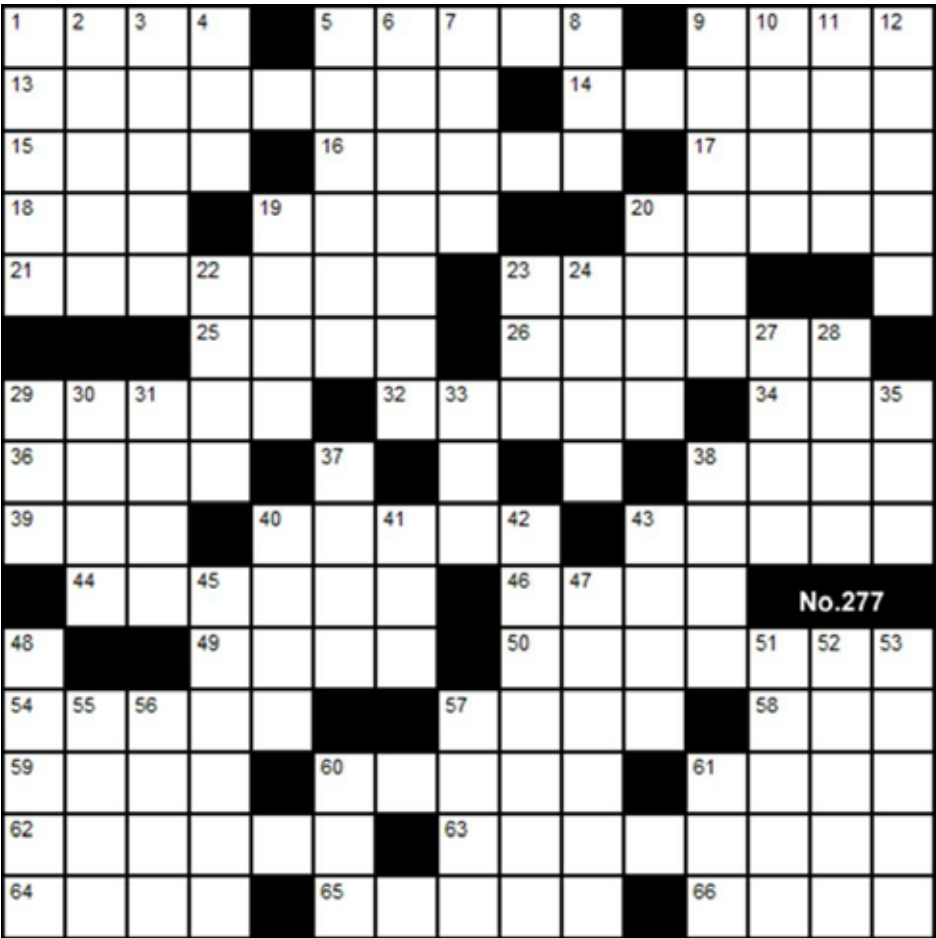

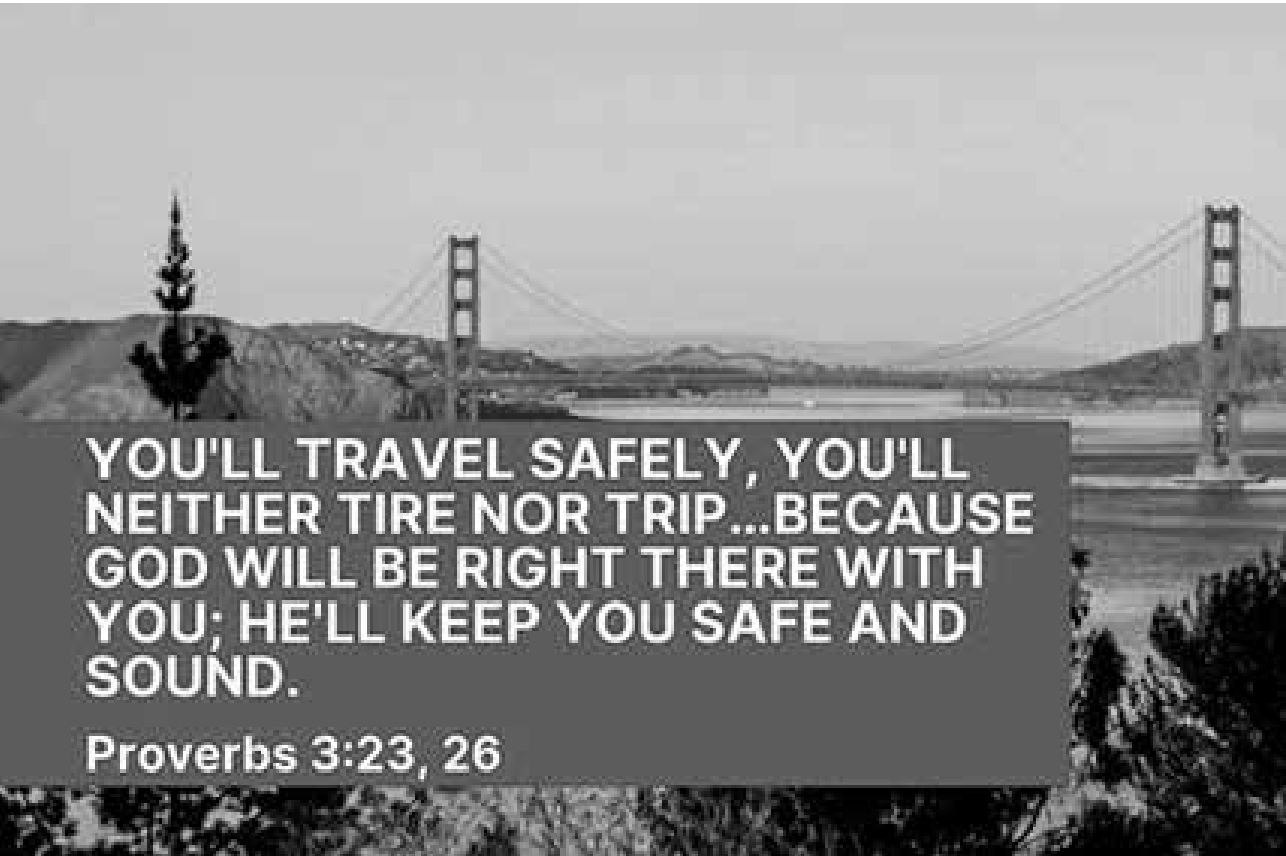

At Baptist Ukraine Seminary: ‘State of Emergency is Our New Normal’

LVIV, Ukraine (BP) – With Russian air raids now just 100 miles northeast of Ukraine Baptist Theological Seminary in Lviv, president Yaroslav “Slavik” Pyzh is challenged to live in a state of emergency as the new normal.

The Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary alumnus spoke with Baptist Press via Zoom March 11 while driving in Lviv, navigating checkpoints and heavy traffic as the war zone expands into western Ukraine.



In addition to providing refugees with food, lodging and medical care, volunteers at Ukraine Baptist Theological Seminary also help them find other, more permanent places to go and help secure transportation. Screen capture from Vimeo

“For the last two weeks, we’ve been in a state of emergency. This state of emergency is our new normal,” Pyzh said. “Now we need to learn how to live in that state of emergency, but not kind of reacting to it, but responding to it.

“That’s the biggest shift in attitude, because you cannot handle long enough if you’re going to be living in a state of emergency reacting to it. We need to learn how to respond to it and start just living, because nobody is living. Everybody is reacting to what is happening.”

Ukraine Baptist Theological Seminary (UBTS), at its Lviv headquarters and other sites, has helped about 8,000 refugees flee the war zone since Russia invaded Ukraine Feb. 24, Pyzh said. About 70 staff members and volunteers are distributing food and clothing, providing beds and transportation, leading

daily devotions and offering counseling, working nearly nonstop.

“So we need to start eating. We need to start sleeping. We need to start resting. We need to start living. And I think this is, we have several things that do not allow you to live,” Pyzh said. “The first thing is you see the rest of the country being bombed, so you sort of, you have this shame feeling that you cannot live, you cannot enjoy life, because everyone else is crying and dying and everything else.

“But sadly, this reality is not going to end

tomorrow. It’s not a matter of weeks. It’s a matter of months and maybe a year or so.”

Pyzh planned to meet with Southern Baptist Send Relief workers hours after his interview with Baptist Press to discuss humanitarian aid. While UBTS has been able to help many in need, he finds the magnitude of the need difficult to assess.

“The need is growing every day, with more advances, with more killing and destruction, the need is becoming greater and greater,” he said. “Even if war stops now, then we still will have needs” helping people resettle and return home. UBTS is expanding its outreach to distribute medicine, food, hygiene items and other necessities.

“We’re working together with Southern Baptists like Send Relief agency. So they are thinking about allocating some funds for us to purchase some of these needs in order to help people,” he said. “I’ll be having a meeting tonight, so we probably will buy like a truckload of food for children (and) first aid kits that are very needed for our soldiers and civilians.

“I’m glad that there is such a country as United States,” he said, thanking Southern Baptists in particular for their support. “If it were not for the United States, we would be having a real hard time here in Ukraine. We still need that miracle (for the war to end) and I still ask every single person I talk to to pray for a miracle, but I see that miracle unfolding every day.”

Jaden's story



Two years ago it was the height of the pandemic and I was spiraling towards rock bottom. I was nineteen years old and my life already seemed hopeless.

My roommate and I put on masks, hoodies, and strapped on backpacks. We walked to the convenience store across the street from our apartment and filled our packs with as much food as we could. Then, we bolted out without paying. We were out of money, out of food and hungry, and I remember thinking to myself, “I am having to steal from a gas station just to eat.”

I had spent the previous three years slowly getting to the point where I was shoplifting food out of hunger. I started partying in high school with friends but when they would go home and sleep after the party, I was always looking for more.

My drug abuse grew and grew. One time I overdosed and spent 10 days in the hospital before being release to a rehab center. But that didn't stop me. I continued using drugs and it got to the point where neither my mom nor my dad (who divorced when I was young) would let me live with them.

I couched surfed at friends' homes but their parents never wanted me to stay too long. I was able to work at call centers even while I struggled with addiction and eventually a coworker and me got an apartment together.

The problem was we were both abusing drugs. I would go to work each day and then come home and drink or use drugs every night. Regularly, the police came to our apartment, but it was late 2020 and the height of the pandemic. The police at that time had a policy where they wouldn't enter a house unless they could tell a felony was being committed or someone was in imminent danger. So, they would tell us to keep it down and leave.

But everyday parties took a toll on our budget and eventually we had no money for food, which lead us to eat stolen gas station peanut butter for weeks straight.

Desperate, I texted my dad and begged him to help me. My dad took me in but I couldn't stay sober and eventually decided to go back to the rehab center I had been to as a teenager. At rehab I quickly contracted COVID and was sent to quarantine in a downtown hotel that had been set aside for the homeless and people in recovery programs who tested positive for COVID.

The hotel, it turned out, had many people living there who were using drugs and I quickly joined them. Providentially, however, there were a few who were sober. One man there who wasn't using drugs was a man on the New Life Program at the Rescue Mission. He told me about the program and how it was helping

him to stay sober and how the Rescue Mission was staying in contact with him while in quarantine.

Even as I continued using drugs at the hotel, I kept thinking about what the man had told me, and about the Rescue Mission's program. When my two weeks of quarantine were up, I had a decision to make. I could go back to the rehab center I started at, or I could pivot and walk over to the Rescue Mission. I chose to walk to the Rescue Mission.

When I entered the Rescue Mission and asked to join the New Life Program I had been high on meth for a week straight all while being sick with COVID at the same time. I crashed out for the night and remember waking up and going to church. I looked around and thought, “I have been using meth for seven straight days and now I am sitting here in church.” It was a surreal experience.

But the faith of the staff and other programmers at the Mission impacted me. I began to understand that the counselors and staff members were not like the people I met at the other rehab centers. They were not there just for a paycheck. I could see that they were working as service to God and their love for God made them care more and work harder to help me. They loved me and cared for me more than other people I had known who tried to help me.

It was not easy to commit to the counseling sessions, introspective homework, bible studies, and other aspects of the New Life Program. It was hard work, but I saw God's providence in leading me to this specific program and I committed to see it through. While it was hard, I appreciated the work therapy at the Mission and how it prepared me for the employment phase of the Mission.

Today, I am happy to report I have a great relationship with my father again. He remarried and has twin, five-year-old daughters and it is fun to be a functional big brother to them. I go to their house once every other week and it's great to have connections with all of them. I am still working on repairing my relationship with my mom, so please pray that our relationship could be healed as well.

I have a good job at a Maverick Country Store. It's not a job I want for my whole life, but it is a good spot for me now. Honestly, compared to the work I did at the Mission, my job at Maverick is not too hard and gives me a chance to relax a little and save some money. Once I have enough money saved up, I plan to move out of the Mission with two other members of the New Life Program with whom I have developed friendships.

I also want to figure out a long-term career (I am only 20 years old) and go to college to make that career into a reality. Beyond saving for an apartment, I also am saving for a car so I can have more mobility and increase my employment and educational opportunities.

I have been sober for over a year and truly believe I have real future. If it were not for your generosity and how you support the New Life Program, I know that I would either be dead, in prison, or homeless right now. You have truly made a difference in my life and I cannot thank you enough for your support of people like me who need the kind of help that can only be found at the Rescue Mission.

Marty's story

When Marty was a boy, his life was filled with tragedy. “I had a terrible upbringing. My mom shot my abusive dad in self-defense, my youngest brother died



in a car wreck and my older brother was murdered,” he says.

He was overwhelmed with grief and anger, and when he was 18, he began numbing his pain with alcohol. “I used it to forget, and before you know it, I was addicted.”

For 40 years, alcohol controlled Marty's life. “I wasn't responsible or reliable. I quit jobs and wound up getting a divorce because of my drinking.”

He completed several rehabs over the years, but always relapsed, most recently while he was passing through Casper on his way east. This time, however, he landed in trouble with the law and wound up in jail. “I knew I wasn't living the way God wanted me to live. He wanted me to change,” Marty says.

When he was released from jail, Marty entered our Discipleship Recovery Program, where chapel services and Bible studies strengthened his faith. “God brought me here because His Word is here and it's filling a void in my life.”

“I have the Word of God in me now.”

Through faith-based life skills classes, Marty has also been processing his grief and developing healthy coping skills to see him through whatever life sends his way. “The biggest thing they've taught me is that I don't have to be alone. If I'm struggling, I can always talk to somebody here at the Mission.”

After graduation, Marty plans to retire, work part-time and continue growing in his faith. “I'm going to find a home church, volunteer at the Mission and let God continue doing His work in me,” he says.

Your generous support has filled Marty's life with love, encouragement, and most of all, hope this Easter season. “Before I came to the Mission, I was hopeless, but now God is in charge of my life and I'm living the way I was meant to.”

Citizens in a Wyoming town who have been fighting to have their public library move inappropriate books out of the children's section seem to have caught a break.

Local residents have been challenging Campbell County Commissioners and the Gillette library board because of books in the children's section that promote abhorrent sexual behavior. Though their concerns at have been soundly rejected at those meetings, local businessman Hugh Bennett of Wyoming MassResistance says they seem to be getting their message across.

"D.G. Reardon, one of the liberal members of the Campbell County Commissioners, resigned without notice," Bennett reports. "He gave various reasons, but as with many of these things, you always wonder



what the real reason is."

The liberal commissioner represented a conservative part of Campbell County, so Bennett suggests Reardon did not like what he was hearing from constituents.

"The more the people who are liberal dug in on this issue, the longer it stewed and festered in the psyche of the community, and the more people talked about it," the businessman submits. "I'm sure he did get feedback that wasn't very enjoyable."

A conservative has been appointed to the position. After the library board chairman resigned suddenly, county commissioners recently approved changes designed to squelch free speech during their meetings, so Wyoming MassResistance hopes the new appointee will help reverse those changes.

PP Backs ‘Savage’ Proposal

“A baby feels pain at least at 19 weeks, and we’re talking about excruciating pain,” she says of abortion. “The baby hasn’t been developing all the sensors that mitigate the pain.”

Some scientists claim a preborn child can feel pain as early as 12 weeks into the pregnancy. Nevertheless, abortion giant Planned Parenthood has thrown its support behind the legislation.

Pro-lifers are preparing to fend off a major abortion bill pro-aborts have presented to the Colorado Legislature.

Giuliana Day of Life Decisions says the Reproductive Health Equity Act, which calls for abortion for whatever reason through all nine months of pregnancy, is a horrible bill.

“It’s so savage,” she asserts. “It’s so inhumane to allow abortions until the very moment of birth without any kind of restrictions.”

Day points out that a baby is a baby as soon as conception takes place, and the child grows from there in every respect as a human being.

“It’s like a vicious cycle,” the pro-lifer laments. “They support in the schools the hypersexualization of the kids; so these girls get pregnant, and the organizations have customers for life. In exchange, they make so much money that they can contribute to the campaigns of these legislators.”

Life Decisions, which describes itself as a group of people from all walks of life united in the goal to bring love, compassion, no judgment, privacy, confidentiality, support, and care to communities, is gearing up to fight against the measure’s passage. And though it is likely an uphill battle, Day believes it is also a winnable one.

Amid the distress and danger, Pyzh has witnessed a hunger among refugees for relief and rest. UBTS responds with practical help and the Gospel.

“That is actually very effective,” he said. “Everyone is willing to listen. Everyone is willing to be prayed for. Under war, nobody is refusing” outreach, including daily devotions, counseling and prayer. “Everybody is happy to do that. Everyone is ... looking for a glimpse of hope.”

He spoke of a refugee who traveled 30 hours from Kharkiv in eastern Ukraine to reach UBTS.

“When she came to Lviv to our seminary, that was the first time that she was crying,” Pyzh said. “She said, ‘I couldn’t cry before, because I was afraid of bombs exploding and killings and everything else.’ That’s kind of the need people have.”

Refugees arriving at UBTS peaked three days ago at about 400 people a day, mostly from Kyiv and Kharkiv, before subsiding, Pyzh said, but he expects numbers to increase.

“We expect it to pick up in the next couple of days because the war is kind of expanding geographically,” he said, “so I think people will be coming from other parts of Ukraine.”

About 2.5 million people have fled the country, the United Nations said, with another 2 million internally displaced. The U.N. has recorded 549 civilian deaths and 957 injuries in Ukraine since Russia launched its invasion, U.N. High Commissioner for Human Rights spokesperson Liz Throssell said in a March 11 press briefing from Geneva, indicating the actual number of casualties and injuries could be “much higher.”

“Civilians are being killed and maimed in what appear to be indiscriminate attacks, with Russian forces using explosive weapons with wide area effects in or near populated areas,” Throssell said. “These include missiles, heavy artillery shells and rockets, as well as airstrikes.”

Russia struck military airfields in Lutsk and

Ivano-Frankivsk March 10, ABC News reported, striking targets as close as 85 miles from Lviv.

Despite the war, Pyzh has no plans to end relief operations and flee to Poland, but will rather expand relief efforts to reach refugees from Ukraine in Poland.

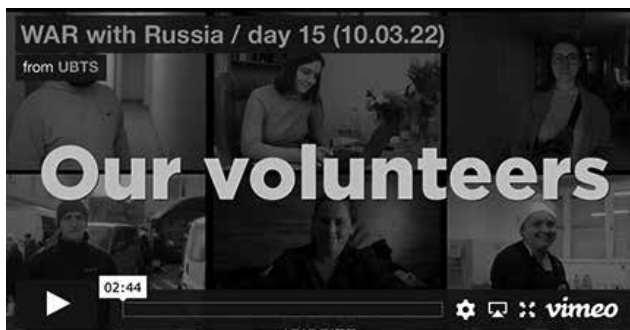
“The thing is I really believe, and I don’t have doubts, we will win,” he said. “So to say I have escape plan? No, I don’t have escape plan. I have expansion plan. So we will expand.”

“Another thing I know for sure, we’re not going to be the same seminary we used to be. Something will change. And something drastic will change, because the situation is different and will be different. I don’t think we will be a classical seminary. I think we will emphasize the role of the church in society, raising people with spiritual values and things like that. But we’re not going to be training church people for church.”

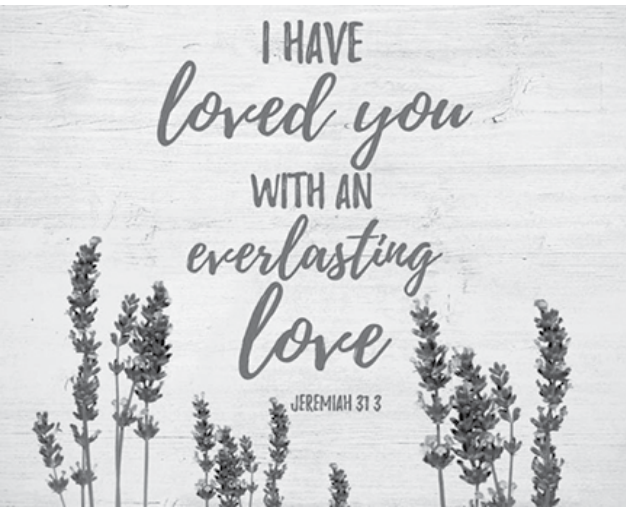
